



2023 Target: At least 70% of the people perceive the entrenchment of the culture of respect for human rights, the rule of law and due process.





2023 Target: Level of conflict emanating from ethnicity, all forms of exclusion, religious and political differences is at most 50% of 2013 levels.







The Strategy for the Harmonization of Statistics in Africa (SHaSA 2) is Africa's pioneering effort to include the domain of Governance, Peace and Security (GPS) in official statistics. From 2012 to 2017, a group of African statisticians\* under the leadership of the AUC developed and pilot-tested in 16 countries\*\* a harmonized methodology for the periodic monitoring of GPS by national statistical offices across the continent. With the GPS-SHaSA survey modules, countries can easily monitor their progress in meeting Aspirations 3 (on Good Governance) and 4 (on Peace and Security) of the AU's Agenda 2063: The Africa We Want and the UN's Sustainable Development Goal 16 on Peaceful, Just and Inclusive Societies.
