ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- 1. The African Union (**AU**) shall implement Part 2(a) of the Eastern Africa Regional Statistics Program-for-Results (the **Project**). The International Development Association (hereinafter the **Association**) is providing financing for the Project.
- 2. The African Union shall implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for each of these.
- 3. The African Union shall also comply with the provisions of any other environmental and social (E&S) documents required under the ESF and referred to in this ESCP, such as the E-Waste Management Plans and the Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP), and the timelines specified in those E&S documents.
- 4. The African Union is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by the African Union Commission, STATAFRIC, or any unit attached thereto referenced in 1. above.
- 5. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP shall be monitored and reported to the Association by the African Union as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Association shall monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
- 6. As agreed by the Association and the African Union, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the African Union shall agree to the changes with the Association and shall update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP shall be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Association and the African Union. The African Union shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the African Union shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address the risk and impacts, which may include environmental, health, and safety impacts, labour influx, gender-based violence.
